- All board meeting notices are publicized in accordance with public meeting laws.
- All board meetings shall commence with the Pledge of Allegiance.
- The chair will utilize the gavel as needed to maintain order, commence and adjourn meetings, and signal approval of motions.
- The board reserves the right to recess to executive session as may be required at any time during these meetings, pursuant to ORS 192.660(1).

### BOCC DISCUSSION ITEM PUBLIC WORKS PROPOSAL FOR A JURISDICTIONAL TRANSFER TO THE CITY OF BAY CITY

Date: June 7th, 2023

Tillamook County Public Works (TCPW) is proposing a jurisdictional transfer of authority to the City of Bay City involving developed, as well as undeveloped, dedicated public right of ways within both the city limits and the urban growth boundary of Bay City. This represents all of the county dedicated public right of way inside the Bay City developmental footprint, with the exception of the northwesternmost portion of Alderbrook Loop Road. The following is a breakdown of the particular type and location of the right of ways proposed for jurisdictional transfer.

- 3,750 linear feet of county maintained roads inside the city limits.
- 2,200 linear feet of county maintained roads inside the urban growth boundary.
- 3,500 linear feet of local access roads inside the urban growth boundary.
- 8,000 linear feet of undeveloped public right of ways (mostly alleys) inside the urban growth boundary.

Last January, a severe windstorm blew through our county resulting in a number of lengthy power outages. One such outage, which affected Bay City, was due to destruction of utility poles and aerial lines on Hobsonville Drive. The initial repairs required permitting (post action) through TCPW despite the work being done within the city limits. While the permit was expedited as part of an emergency response, it was still an additional step in what could have been arranged directly between Bay City and TPUD.


On the eastern side of the city limits there is a section of Bewley Street which is divided between City and County jurisdictions along its centerline. The northbound lane is a county road, and the southbound lane is a city road. When a burst waterline ruptured the pavement of Bewley Street there was an element of uncertainty introduced to the response due to this odd jurisdictional boundary.


Portions of downtown Bay City have been paved through the city's maintenance efforts despite these roads (Main, 7<sup>th</sup>, and Pennsylvania) currently being under county jurisdiction. Meanwhile, the installation and repair of city waterlines are supposed to require permitting through the county when done within their urban growth boundary. Similar juxtapositions can be found regarding signage, road striping, and vegetation management.

As a condition of this proposed jurisdictional transfer, Bay City has requested that the two local access roads (Seattle and Baseline) be repaved in order to bring them up to city standards. Normally, maintenance of these county local access roads is the responsibility of the individuals who use the roads to access their properties. Spending county public funds on the improvement of these local access roads requires authorization from the Board of County Commissioners.

Transferring jurisdictional authority over the public right of ways inside Bay City's urban growth boundary and the city limits would resolve the aforementioned inconsistencies. It would empower the city to have greater control over their future community development within the area where it is intended. Simultaneously, it would allow TCPW to focus our efforts on areas of our community which do not have as many available resources.
