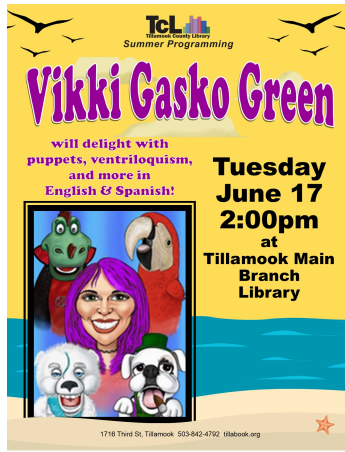

Hands and Hearts Drumming in Rockaway Beach

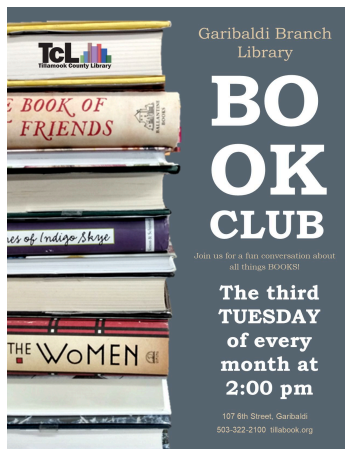
Let's get into the rhythm with Hands and Hearts Drumming!

Spy Kids is rated PG, for action sequences.

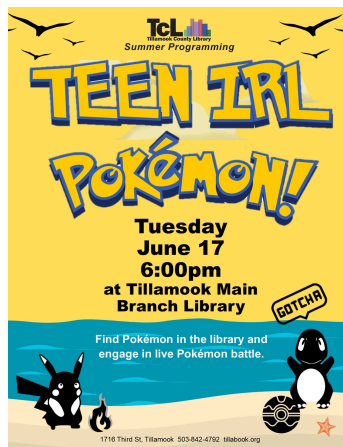

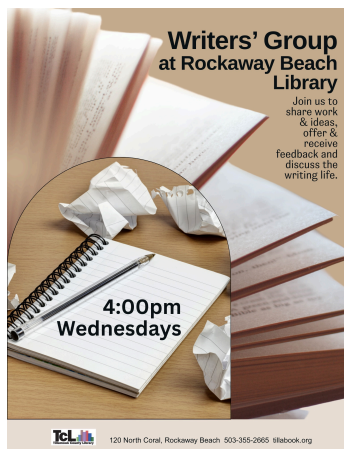

Rockaway Writers Group

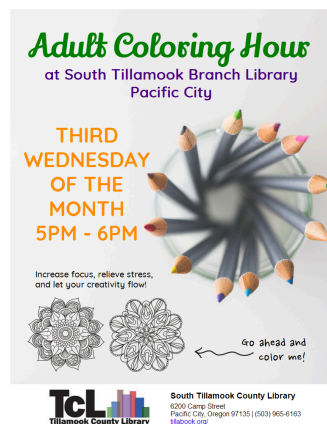
Writers new and old are welcome!

James Scott (formerly writing as B J Scott) is a writer and speaker. He is the multiple-award-winning author of five historical novels set in the Old West in the last half of the 19th century, a novel set in 1929-1940s southern California, and a speculative fiction novel set in the near future. His stories are often built around actual historical events and have a common theme: they feature strong, courageous women. Though the stories revolve around women, these are men's adventure stories, but with female protagonists—fast-paced and action-packed. His novel, *Light On A Distant Hill*, won the 2011 WILLA Literary Award for Original Softcover Fiction sponsored by Women Writing the West.

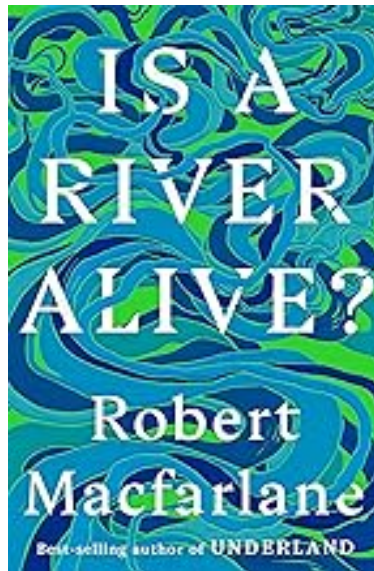

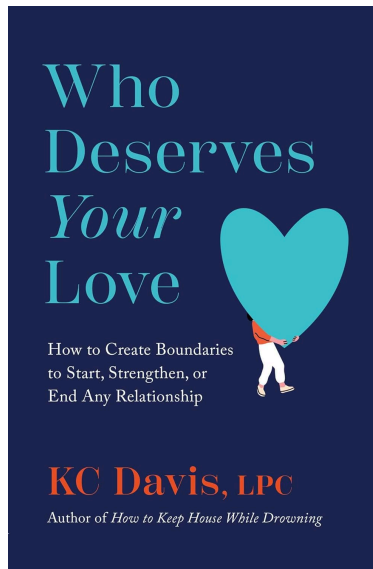

Is a river alive?

Robert Macfarlane

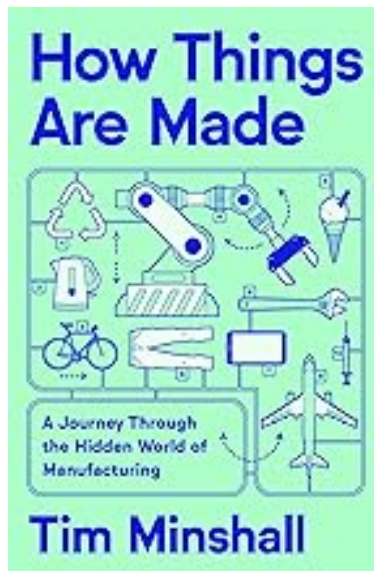
