Library Director Sara Charlton to Retire in June

Sara Charlton, Director of the Tillamook County Library, will be retiring June 1, 2020. She has been the Director of the Tillamook County Library since 1991. Prior to moving to Tillamook, Sara served in libraries in West Virginia and Pennsylvania. She earned a BA in Music from the University of Charleston and a Masters in Library Science from the University of Pittsburgh. Sara also studied for a Master of Public Administration at Penn State and is a graduate of the University of Oregon Pacific Program.

Charlton's accomplishments at the Tillamook County Library are too many to list. Nearly all of the services the library offers countywide were shaped and established under Sara's direction. A few highlights include automating our collection with an online catalog and virtual library with online databases, forming the Oceanbooks sharing network we enjoy with Lincoln county, and introducing the Internet to all TCL locations. During her tenure, Sara also guided the addition of the new main library in Tillamook, assisted in building the South Tillamook County Library in Pacific City, and the Rockaway Beach Library. She was instrumental in adding the RFID system to the library as well as the current Library Park project.

Community involvement and leadership was a high priority for Sara. She served in many different capacities on various efforts such as the Oregon Library Association Legislation Committee for 25 years, Oregon State Library LSTA for 6 years, Tillamook Kiwanis, the Tillamook County Futures Council, the



Tillamook County Arts Network, the Bay City Pearl Fest, Bay City Planning Commission and so much more. Sara was also very active in state and national library boards and committees. She not only served our state as the President of the Oregon Library Association in 1998-1999, but she also has served nationally on various prestigious boards throughout her years here. Sara was honored as the Oregon Library Association "Librarian of the Year" in 1995.

Sara would like to thank everyone who has helped to make the Tillamook County Library one of the best in Oregon. She would like to thank the community and let our residents know it has been an honor working with them over the last 29 years.

Sara's retirement party will be Friday, May 29, 2-4pm in the Library's Community Rooms. The program will start at 2:30 pm and the public is invited to attend.

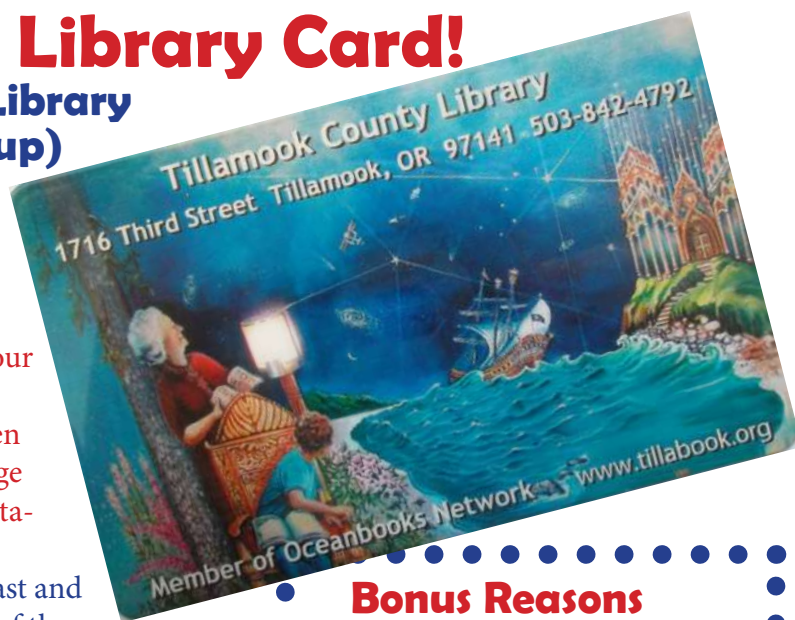

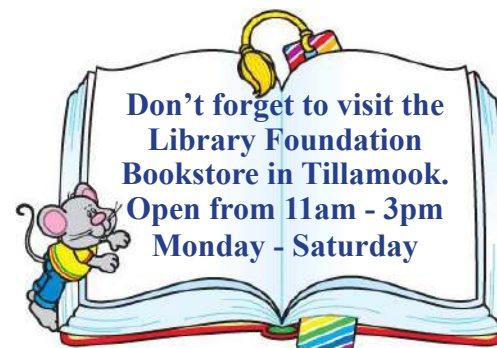
