How Much Money Does the Library Save You?



It's easy to forget what an amazing value a library card can be. The small stack of materials shown above is a good example of what the average person might take home on a visit to the library. Let's see how it adds up.

3 DVDs at \$25 ea	\$75.00
1 Book on CD	
1 Oregon Guidebook	
1 Baldacci novel	\$30.00
3 Kids' books @ \$14 ea.	\$42.00
1 Magazine	\$6.00

GRAND TOTAL = \$246.00!

Compare that to what Tillamook homeowners pay in taxes each year. For instance, if your home has an assessed value of \$100,000, your taxes would be about \$65 for the year. That is less than the cost of the three DVDs in the illustration above. Then add the value of the programs you attend, the times you use the library meeting rooms, and the research we help you with on our databases. That is proof of the value of a library card!

Keeping Pace with the Changing World

Libraries all over the world have changed to meet the demands of the public and are busier than ever! Just like a commercial business, a library has to keep up with the times or people will stop coming. One visit to our libraries and you will see we have taken that idea to heart. Most people know the Tillamook County Library has regular and large print books, DVDs, public Internet access, story times for children, librarian-assisted Reference questions, branch libraries throughout the county and a Bookmobile that makes over 120 stops per month. But I would like to focus on the services we have added in the last ten years that you might not know about.

The Main Library's two community rooms are busier than ever and can be reserved with your library card. Upstairs, the four study rooms are now used an average of ninety times a month!

Need help with a computer, tablet or smart phone? Our one-on-one technology training will get you on the right track. Ask for an appointment at any of our locations.

The library is not limited to our physical buildings anymore either. In the past ten years, we have added an increasing number of databases that are available 24/7 to our residents. We have Mango language-learning software, World Book Online, Business Collection Online, Learning Express (practice tests for topics like GED, civil service exams, pre-law, etc), genealogy research with Heritage Quest Online, Legal Info Resource Online, 500 encyclopedias on Credo, Library 2 Go (eBooks and audio books), Hoopla (downloadable eBooks, audio books, digital comics, music, movies and tv shows), and Zinio for E-magazines! All of these


can be accessed from home or your local library.

People asked for more programs for Teens and Adults and we listened. Take in a music program, author talk, crafting class, or one of the many other programs offered. We even had a New

Year's Eve party for families last year!

But hold on, I'm just getting started! Here are a few more services we have added in the last decade. In the spring, the Seed Library features thousands of seed packets for people to take. Borrow a Book Club Kit for your Book club that comes complete with ten copies of a book and questions to aid your discussion. We have a wonderful digital microfilm reader to browse the Headlight Herald archives. You can even conduct genealogical research on microfilm. Of course, we have a public photocopier that also scans documents into a PDF file. The county Law Library is located at our Tillamook location. Investigate our Spanish language collection. We have fantastic subject-oriented book and material kits to help teachers and daycares with their curriculum. In the summer we partner with Grub Club to make sure kids have food to eat. And every spring we partner with AARP to help seniors do their taxes.

One of the great perks to our library system has been the formation of our Oceanbooks Network. Through this partnership, we share books and other library materials with libraries in

I could go on and on, but as you can see, the library today is about so much more than just books. I would like to invite you to stop by and "check us out"!



Proposed Levy to Renew Countywide Library Services











MEASURE 29-146

Since 1983, the Tillamook County Library (TCL) has been funded by an operating levy approved by voters. This proposed levy replaces a 5-year levy expiring June 2017, which provides over 95% of TCL funding.

WHAT WOULD MEASURE 29-146 DO?

Public library operations:

- Maintain libraries that serve all county residents in Tillamook, Bay City, Garibaldi, Manzanita, Pacific City and Rockaway Beach.
- Maintain bookmobile service, which visits 120 locations monthly.
- Maintain library open hours.

Reading programs for children and teens:

- Maintain children's reading programs that average over 5,500 child visits each year, such as summer reading and literacy programs for preschoolers so more children enter school ready to read.
- Maintain summer reading activities designed to sustain reading retention.
- Maintain reading and learning programs for students, including online homework and tutoring services designed to improve school success for all children in the County.

Book purchases:

• Maintain purchase of books, e-books and other materials that would be available to all users of libraries in Tillamook County.

Services for adults and seniors:

 Maintain services and programs that enrich and enhance the lives of adults and seniors, including bookmobile visits to nursing homes, summer reading programs as well as informational and cultural events.

Resources for job-seekers:

• Maintain library services that provide information, resources & instruction to assist those seeking jobs.

IF PASSED, HOW WOULD MEASURE 29-146 AFFECT A HOMEOWNER'S TAXES?

- The proposed levy would run from July, 2017 through June, 2022.
- The rate would be 65¢ per \$1,000 of assessed value, the same rate approved by voters in 2007 and 2012.
- In 2017, owners of a home with an average assessed value of \$100,000 (not market value) would pay about \$65.

WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF THE LEVY DOES NOT PASS?

• The expiring levy provides over 95% of the total revenue supporting the Tillamook County library system. There are no other identified funding sources to support the libraries in Tillamook, Bay City, Garibaldi, Manzanita, Pacific City and Rockaway Beach or the county bookmobile.




LOYE in the Library!
