



Tax help update



AARP tax help is now officially ready to take sign ups. We ask that you come into the Tillamook Library to

sign up so that we can give you an informational sheet detailing what items to bring. Appointments are available on Fridays until April 10th in half hour increments between 12pm and 4pm. The AARP volunteers are qualified only to help with personal returns and cannot help businesses at this time.

If you aren't lucky enough to get an appointment, we can still help you get those taxes finished. The IRS has sent copies of forms 1040, 1040A, and 1040EZ to all libraries, but no instruction booklets. We can print forms from the IRS website at 10 cents a page. We will also try and extend your computer time if you are working on taxes as long as no other patrons are waiting.


