Kid's Summer Reading program Pops with Science

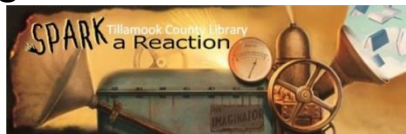

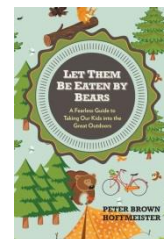
