

Get to know the Marion Barr Library in Bay City



The residents of Bay City have a long history of enjoying a library in their little community. In fact, it was over ninety years ago that the first little library opened on C Street. It was run by volunteers and depended entirely on donations. In 1947 the library became an official branch library in Tillamook County.

The next big move came 50 years ago when the residents of Bay City voted to build a library annex onto the current city hall. They opened on April 1, 1964 and it remains an important part of the community today. In

1985, the library was renamed the Marion Barr Library in appreciation of Ms. Barr who had been a long-time librarian since 1966.

Today, area residents see Debby Riley at the front desk with the library being open Tuesday through Saturday each week. Debby says the community is very thankful to have the convenience of a library branch in their town. In addition to a weekly storytime program on Thursdays, the library also offers internet access on three public computers and free Wi-Fi access to those with their own devices.


