

Improvements coming to Library2Go



If you have never used our Library 2 Go service to check out e-books from the library, now is a great time to start. Overdrive, the company behind the Library 2 Go site, plans to roll out improved features this month that will allow you

to read your e-book from within the internet browser window. This will require fewer steps between checkout and reading, and many users will not need to download any extra software! E-books will still be accessible the old way to support all devices and reading platforms. The new experience will work best with Google Chrome, and users of Internet Explorer may need to install the Google Chrome Frame Plugin. Please check our website in mid-March for more specific instructions.



Rockaway Beach Library – Branch of the Month

The history of the Rockaway Beach Branch Library goes all the way back to 1925, when the men of Rockaway Beach would not let the women join their civic club. So the women started their own club and got involved with various community projects, including sidewalks and public toilets. The Women's Civic Club of Rockaway bought lots at 120 N. Coral St. in 1946. The new building was completed in 1948 with much community involvement.



In 1996, the Rockaway Women's Club disbanded. The Club offered the building for a library if money could be raised for the necessary renovation. Up to then, library service was a few hours of bookmobile service. Rockaway residents banded together to raise the estimated \$100,000 for repair and updating. There were bake sales, rummage sales, book sales, a haunted house, a Beanie Baby auction, grants from various Oregon groups, an arts and crafts show, a cook book and more.

It took a few years, but finally the "new" library opened on July 3, 1999 in partnership with the Tillamook County Library. The Rockaway Friends own and maintain the building while the Tillamook County Library provides the library staff, computer system, books and other library materials, deliveries and free WiFi. It's been a successful public/private partnership ever since.

The Rockaway Friends continues as a public charity, where an annual membership is \$5 per person or \$10 per family. For more information, please call 503-355-2665.
