


Library2Go Improvements

Branch of the Month



The first library in Manzanita was founded in 1947. It was located in a small room in the Community Club, sponsored by the Manzanita Women's Club. The Women's Club and the City of Manzanita shared the library's financial responsibilities and met needs of the community for many years. In the early 1980s, an anonymous donation of \$1,000 sparked interest in building a larger library to serve the needs of the growing community.

It took years of planning, organizing and fundraising to make the dream a reality. In 1987 the current library on Laneda Avenue was built and dedicated. Countless residents and committees joined forces during the process, providing a testament to what determination and community pride can envision and achieve. Local architect Tom Bender donated his services and helped apply for a successful federal grant.

Today, the Manzanita Library remains a bright spot in the community and the North Tillamook Library Friends are active in making sure the library keeps up with future needs. Stop in to see Charlotte, Peg or Brian the next time you are in Manzanita!

Visit the Bookstore!


