

Summer Reading is in Full Swing

Summer Reading is going strong! We had about 200 people come to our first summer reading program, storyteller Will Hornyak. Our teen programs have also been enjoying great attendance, with an average of 20-25 teens per program, up from an average of 12 per program last year. For the first time, we also have special teen programs at our Pacific City Library. So far, at the Main Library only, we have seen about 800 kids sign up for summer reading. It's not too late to join in the fun! Sign up at any library branch. Kids receive prizes at 4, 8, and 12 hours read. Teens are encouraged to read for 20 hours, and adults read 8 books.

FREE BOOKS!

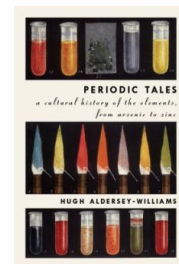
