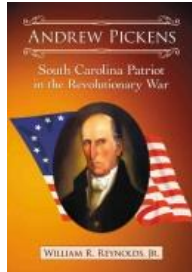

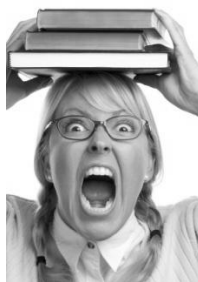
Please help us to keep the library a pleasant place for everyone by silencing your cell phones when you enter the building. We encourage you to take your calls in the downstairs lobby.



Visit the Bookstore!

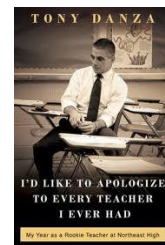
