

Teen Author Christine Fletcher

Christine Fletcher, an award-winning Oregon author of novels for teens, will speak on **Saturday**, **April 9**, **2011 at 11 am**. The program will be held in the community room at the Tillamook County Library. Light refreshments will be served.

Fletcher, a practicing veterinarian, suspended her job to write her first novel, *Tallulah Falls*. When seventeen-year-old Tallulah Addy gets a frantic message from her best friend Maeve, she drops everything, including her own difficult family, and sets out from Oregon to rescue her. But a few days later it's Tallulah who needs the help. *Tallulah Falls* is about a runaway teen discovering the power she holds in her own life. *Tallulah Falls* was named a Book for the Teen Age by the New York Public Library and optioned for film.

Ruby is forced to drop out of school to support her family, and soon Ruby is getting paid to dance with lonely men at the Starlight Club. Anne O'Malley, in a *Booklist* review, observed *Ten Cents a Dance* "will have readers rooting for its spirited, soul-searching heroine." *Ten Cents a Dance* was named a YALSA Top Ten Best Book for Young Adults, awarded a BCCB Blue Ribbon, and has been chosen for several state reading lists, among other honors.

Christine is currently working on her third YA novel while still working part-time as a veterinarian.



Portland Author Dana Haynes

Dana Haynes, an award-winning Portland author, will speak at the Tillamook County Library on **April 2nd at 11:00am** in the Hatfield community room.

Haynes is the author of *Crashers*, a thriller set in Portland, Oregon. When the next 9/11-type terrorist attack occurs in Portland, the person responsible for the attack isn't another Osama bin Laden. *Crashers* features a team of characters who work for NTSB (National Transportation Safety Board).



Haynes is the recipient of the 2011 Spotted Owl Award for his novel *Crashers*. The award is chosen by a volunteer committee of Friends of Mystery members, and is announced in the spring of the year.

A newspaperman for many years, Dana Haynes has also used his writing skills to pen mysteries under the pseudonym Conrad Haynes. He is currently the Public Affairs Manager for Portland Community College.

Celebrate National Poetry Month by checking out some of these poetry collections at the Tillamook County Library, for kids, teens, and adults:


