
Classic Romances

Lucy Honeychurch falls in love while on a visit to Florence and must choose between fulfilling her social role or following her heart.


Humorous Romances

Sunday, February 14: Happy Valentine Day! Be sure to send your sweetheart a card, flowers, candy or all three.






Fish Without a Doubt

Staff Profile: Irene Greenfield



Few characters created by American writers cast longer shadows than Robert E. Howardos Conan the barbarian. Even if you have never read a single Conan story you probably have some impression of who he is. However, if your idea of Conan is a dim-witted muscle man stuffed into a loincloth, you couldnot be further from the truth

Admittedly, Conan can be found sporting a loincloth from time to time, but what makes him such an enduring

and very American character is that he perfectly captures the dark and gritty spirit of the Depression era West. Based on the authorøs experiences with prizefighters, bootleggers, oil field bullies and honest workmen, Conan is a wonderful expression of those desperate and uncertain times. Add in some exotic locales, some rip roaring adventure, and you have a fantasy classic.
