### in the LIBRARY

The Tillamook County Library would like to invite you and your baby to **Babies in the Library**, a wonderful world filled with songs and rhymes, clapping hands and smiling faces, wide eyes and comfortable laps.

The **Babies in the Library** program is for babies (birth- 18 months) accompanied by a caring adult. Siblings are welcome, as are moms, dads, grandparents, caregivers, etc.

Each session of **Babies in the Library** will focus on early literacy skills such as; rhyming, repetition, reading aloud and oral language. These skills will be shared within a twenty to thirty minute storytime of songs, bounces and reading, followed by play and chat time. An assortment of baby friendly board books will be available for check out.



**Babies in the Library** is held at the Tillamook County Library on the 1st and 3rd Monday of each month. The program begins at 10 a.m. and usually lasts about 45 minutes.

## Dia de los Muertos Teen Program:

Teens are welcome to celebrate el dia de los muertos (the Day of the Dead) at the Tillamook County Library by creating their very own calavera pins.

The Day of the Dead is observed on November 2 each year throughout Latin America. It is a special day to remember and celebrate loved ones who have passed. 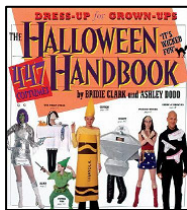
