

Staff's Choice! The \$64 Tomato by William Alexander



The title pretty much sums up this hilarious book that most gardeners or wannabes will easily relate to. From children who decry his obsession, õWhy canot Dad be more like other dads?ö while eagerly lapping up his great potato-leek soup from leeks harvested in December when a hard freeze is predicted, to tallying up the final bill for garden design, excavation, irrigation, electric fencing, posts for fencing, posthole digger, topsoil, havahart trap, forsythia border, gas-

powered hedge trimmer for forsythia border, wood chip mulch for forsythia border (are you beginning to get the picture?), this guy is non-stop in the garden. Then there's Superchuck, the infernal groundhog that's never deterred by electric fencing strung three inches apart or the 10,000-volt charger quickly ordered to save the Brandywine tomatoes. The challenges are many and Alexander is up to the task. In summary he says that gardening is, by its very nature, an expression of the triumph of optimism over experience. No matter how bad this year was, there's always next year's something all of us, gardeners or not, could keep in mind.
