

## New Resources from the State Library!

During the 2003-2005 biennium, the Oregon State Legislature authorized Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) funds to subsidize the purchase of basic electronic resources for all Oregon libraries under the Oregon Statewide Database Licensing Program. From 2005 to 2009 the LSTA funds provided a 50% subsidy for academic and public libraries and fully funded school and tribal libraries. As of September 1, 2009 LSTA funding will be used to fully subsidize the 18 databases being provided by Gale/CENGAGE Learning.

Reflecting the change in state funding, Tillamook County libraries will be switching from our current EBSCO database subscriptions to the LSTA funded Gale/CENGAGE databases. **Saturday, October 31:** Have a safe and happy Halloween!


