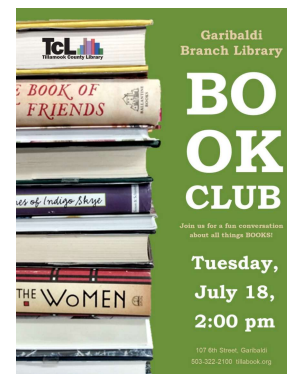

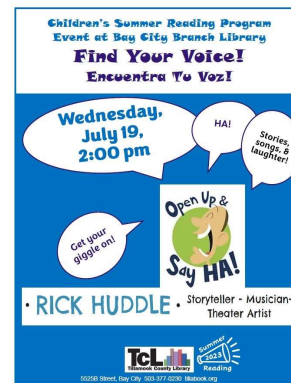
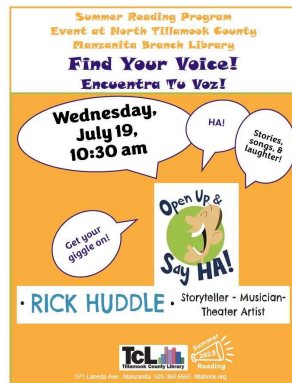

- 2:00pm at the Bay City Branch Library

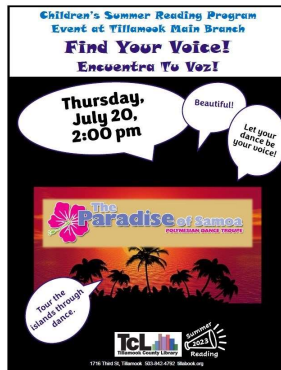


## Summer Reading Children's Movie

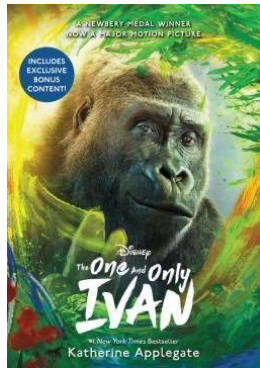

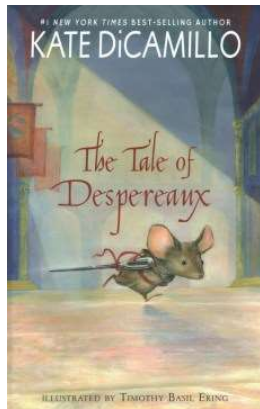

by Katherine Applegate

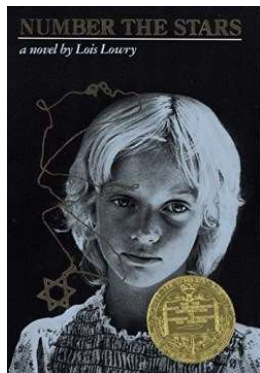

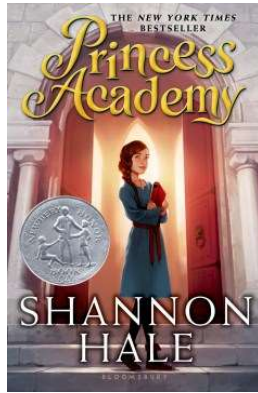

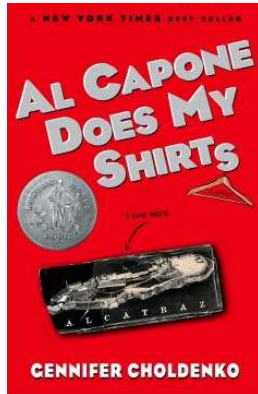


### **Princess Academy**

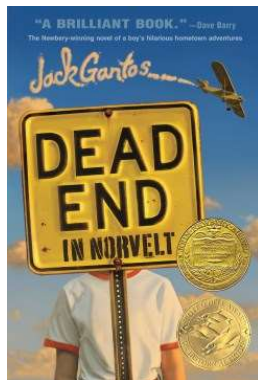

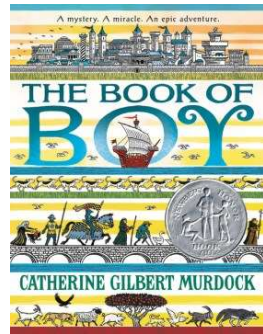


### **Dead end in Norvelt**
