Oregon Humanities Conversation Project

We're excited to announce that we are hosting the Oregon Humanities Conversation Project: Talking about Dying with Jenny Sasser!

Join us for this conversation at the North Tillamook Library in Manzanita this Saturday, May 20th at 10:30am.

Death is a universal event that transcends many of the differences between us. While we focus most on the quality of our lives and well-being, we rarely talk about the quality of our dying and deaths. Now in its sixth year, Oregon Humanities' Talking about Dying program offers an opportunity to reflect on the stories and cultural



influences that shape our thinking about this theme and to share perspectives and ideas with fellow community members. During the program, participants explore such questions as, How might our family, traditions, rituals, religion, and beliefs shape how we think about death? What would a "good death" look like for us? What do we want—and not want—at the end of our life? What are the essential considerations?

Jennifer (Jenny) Sasser is an educational gerontologist, transdisciplinary scholar, and community activist. She has worked in the field of gerontology for more than half her life, beginning as a nursing assistant and aging advocate before focusing on research, writing, and teaching. After completing her doctorate from Oregon State University, she joined the Marylhurst University faculty in 1997, where she was Founding Director of Gerontology and Chair of Human Sciences until 2015. Jenny is the author of the books Aging: Concepts and Controversies and Gerontology: The Basics, as well as many essays and articles. She convenes the Gero-Punk Project and offers consulting, facilitations, and presentations throughout North America. Currently, she works as an educational gerontologist and is on the gerontology faculty at Portland Community College.


Summer Reading is Coming


Did You Know...

You can stream ad-free videos with Kanopy? With Kanopy you can watch videos from BBC Studios, IFC Films, The Great Courses and so much more! Kanopy is the service to "find movies, documentaries, foreign films, classic cinema, independent films and educational videos that inspire, enrich and entertain" (kanopy.com).

To get started, download the Kanopy app onto your smart device, or visit https://www.kanopy.com/en/tillamook. First time users will need to create an account. Once your email has been verified, you will be asked to enter your library card number and pin (your pin is typically the first four letters of your last name and the last four numbers of your phone number, all lower case and no spaces. Example: abcd1234). Now you're ready to stream!

Just like Hoopla, Kanopy users have a limited number of checkouts per month. Each library card has 20 checkouts or play credits per month. Each video played will use 1 play credit. Once a play credit has been used, you will have 3 days to view the video as many times as you like without using another play credit.
