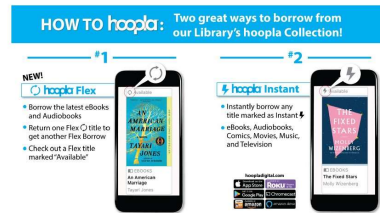


Teen Anime Club: 4 Weeks of Femme Fatal

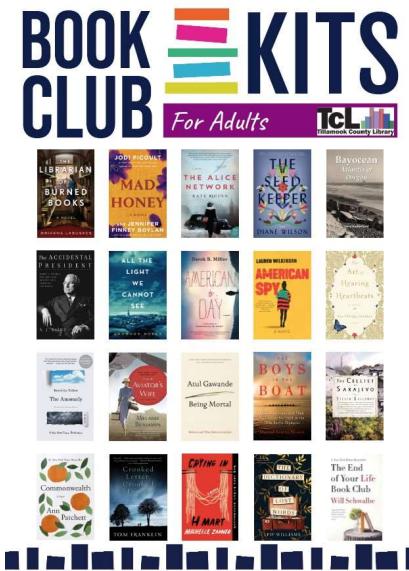
Some Changes Coming to Hoopla

Starting next week, changes are coming to the Tillamook County Library's digital collection on Hoopla. The library will be adding Hoopla Flex to the digital materials available to cardholders on October 2nd. Hoopla Flex allows the library to acquire licenses for more popular eBooks and audiobooks to complement the offerings already available through Hoopla Instant. This change will allow the library to build its digital collection and offset the costs of Hoopla Instant over time.

The library will offer 12 Hoopla Instant checkouts - identified by the lightning bolt symbol - monthly, along with 8 Hoopla Flex checkouts - signified by the revolving arrows symbol - to use at any time (if you ever run out of Hoopla Flex borrows, simply return one Flex title and select a new one), for a combined potential of at least 20 checkouts per month. The library looks forward to providing more materials to meet the growing demand for digital materials.

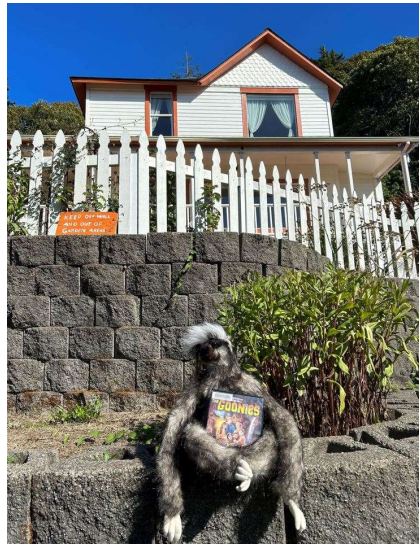
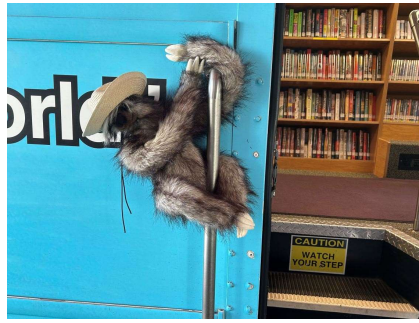


Bookclub Kits

We wish him safe travels to the next libraries on his list!

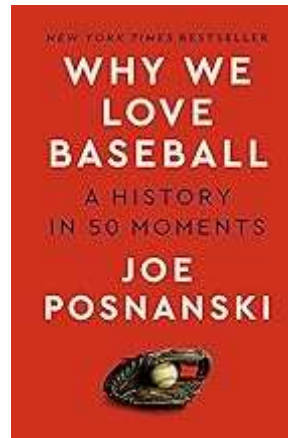

The six : the untold story of America's first women astronauts

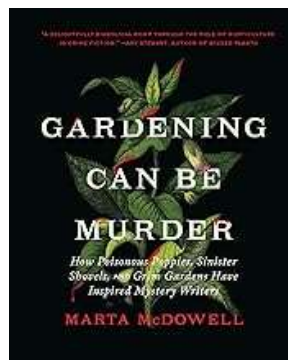
When NASA sent astronauts to the moon in the 1960s and 1970s the agency excluded women from the corps, arguing that only military test pilots--a group then made up exclusively of men--had the right stuff. It was an era in which women were steered away from jobs in science and deemed unqualified for space flight. Eventually, though, NASA recognized its blunder and opened the application process to a wider array of hopefuls, regardless of race or gender. From a candidate pool of 8,000 six elite women were selected in 1978--Sally Ride, Judy Resnik, Anna Fisher, Kathy Sullivan, Shannon Lucid, and Rhea Seddon. In *The Six*, acclaimed journalist Loren Grush shows these brilliant and courageous women enduring claustrophobic--and sometimes deeply sexist--media attention, undergoing rigorous survival training, and preparing for years to take multi-million-dollar payloads into orbit. Together, the Six helped build the tools that made the space program run. One of the group, Judy Resnik, sacrificed her life when the Space Shuttle Challenger exploded at 46,000 feet. Everyone knows of Sally Ride's history-making first space ride, but each of the Six would make their mark.



Why we love baseball : a history in 50 moments

Posnanski writes of major moments that created legends, and of forgotten moments almost lost to time. It's Willie Mays's catch, Babe Ruth's called shot, and Kirk Gibson's limping home run; the slickest steals; the biggest bombs; and the most triumphant no-hitters. But these are also moments raw with the humanity of the game, the unheralded heroes, the mesmerizing mistakes drenched in pine tar, and every story, from the immortal to the obscure, is told from a unique perspective. Whether of a real fan who witnessed it, or the pitcher who gave up the home run, the umpire, the coach, the opposing player--these are fresh takes on moments so powerful they almost feel like myth.
