Come prepared to hang out, eat snacks, and do some activities!




Storytime in Pacific City


Storytimes at Tillamook Return October 1st

Oregon Humanities Conversation Project: Loneliness and Aging

We're excited to announce that we're hosting the the Oregon Humanities Conversation Project: Loneliness and Aging with Pamela Slaughter!

Loneliness and isolation are common experiences for elderly people, especially for those who do not have nearby family members or who are not computer literate. What do you know about the elders in your life or in your neighborhood? Are they connected to their families in an enriching way? Do they belong to a caring community of some kind? This conversation is for elderly people and people who live near elders or have elderly people in their lives to explore questions, experiences, and obstacles to showing up for elderly people and to generate ideas for connection.

Pamela Slaughter is a lifelong Oregonian with varied interests. She retired from her career as an adult protective service investigator for Multnomah County, where she saw firsthand how devastating loneliness and isolation can be. Pamela is the founder and executive director of People of Color Outdoors, a nonprofit designed to help facilitate the reconnection of Black, Indigenous, and People of Color to the outdoors. She is the author of the children's book Hi! My Name is Robin!, published in 2020, which she hopes will encourage families to bird watch together.

Harlem Gospel Travelers

Starting in the mid-1960s, local gospel groups and singers began incorporating elements of popular soul and funk styles and in 2006, Chicago-based reissue label Numero Group released Good God! A Gospel Funk Hymnal. Harlem Gospel Traveler's longtime friend and mentor Eli "Paperboy Reed" approached the group with the idea of digging through the Numero catalog and recording some of the gospel funk material, reinterpreted in their own way-from the high-energy, old-school soul of "God's Been Good to Me" to the hip-hop-inflected "Get Involved."



Saint-Saëns

Lang Lang and Andris Nelsons

Lang Lang presents with this album a treasure trove of musical discoveries. Saint-Sans's Piano Concerto No. 2 was recorded with a stellar cast, the Gewandhausorchester and Andris Nelsons and is for Lang Lang a true romantic masterpiece that rivals the greats like Rachmaninoff or Tchaikovsky.
